As part of the research training group 'One Health Approach for Soil-Transmitted Helminths' funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG), two PhD positions in health economics are available at the Robert Koch Institute (RKI) in Berlin.

The research group is led by the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine at Freie Universität Berlin.

Project description

The aim of the PhD project is to develop and implement a high-quality **costing tool** for estimating the costs of government-led STH control programs.

Using the example of the National School-Based Deworming Program (NSBDP) in Kenya, the following objectives will be pursued:

- developing and refining a best practice costing methodology and a set of data collection instruments
- collecting relevant cost data at different administrative levels of the NSBDP,
- developing an interactive software tool that enables program managers to fully describe and visualize the costs of NSBDP activities under different STH control scenarios.
- and conduct a comprehensive cost analysis of NSBDP activities.

The project includes three research stays in Kenya lasting several weeks for development, piloting and data collection.

- Master's degree in health economics or a related field
- Good knowledge of R
