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12 PHD POSITIONS IN THE DFG RESEARCH TRAINING GROUP (GRK) “MANAGERIAL AND ECONOMIC DIMENSIONS OF HEALTH CARE QUALITY” § 28 SUBSECTION 3 HMBHG

Scope of work: part-time

Weekly hours: 75 % of standard work hours per week

We aim to provide a view of quality of care that is as comprehensive as possible. Thus, our research agenda will focus on the relationship between processes and outcomes in a range of contexts. Our interdisciplinary group of health economists will draw upon backgrounds in economics, business administration and medicine and combine econometric, experimental and theoretical methods.

We will require PhD students to attend our course program that consists of seven research-related courses, comprising three core courses, two methods electives, and two free electives designed to facilitate further specialisation in methods or other specific topics. In addition, we will offer electives focusing on statistical software packages and training in complementary skills. The formal education of the PhD students will be augmented by their participation in research seminars and workshops. They will take part in international conferences, benefit from exchange with visiting researchers and will have the possibility to undertake research stays abroad.

The Research Training Group is in cooperation with the University Medical Center Hamburg-Eppendorf (UKE). 8 positions will be at Universität Hamburg while 4 positions will be at UKE.

Responsibilities

Research and active participation in a structured graduate program.

Specific Duties

PhDs are to complete the doctoral qualification program and to write a doctoral dissertation in Business Administration or Economics on a topic related to one of the seven research clusters of the research program that focusses on the relationships that determine quality of care:

1. Provider response to payer incentives: Payers negotiate contracts with providers and set incentives for providers' behaviour, which, in turn, can affect the quality of care they deliver.
2. Quality-related patient preferences for health care provision: Patients' preferences affect their choice of health care provider, but may also have an impact on treatment decisions and the quality of care they receive.
3. Response of the insured to health insurer induced quality of care: Individuals select insurance plans or enrol with statutory insurers and, place themselves within a contractual and regulatory framework that can affect the quality of care they receive.
4. Provider behaviour: The way providers organise the delivery of health care (e.g., by setting up teams or creating networks) is crucial for the quality of care.
5. Impact of patient characteristics on the quality of health care: Depending on individual characteristics such as preferences, prior health knowledge and health care seeking behaviour, patients, as co-producers of health, decide when and how to use the health care system, and engage in behaviours that may influence the quality of care they receive.
6. Impact of health insurers' investments in the quality of health care: In competitive, insurance-based systems like that in Germany, health insurers influence the quality of care through strategic decisions taken when competing with each other.
7. New directions in defining and measuring the quality of health care: This additional research area will be devoted to refining existing and developing new concepts and measures of health care quality and of how quality is perceived.

Requirements

Applicants will be required to have a Master's degree in a research-oriented Master's program in economics, business administration or health economics with at least above-average results. On completion of the Master's degree (including a Bachelor's degree) applicants ideally should have reached the equivalent of 300 ECTS points. We may also consider applicants from other disciplines if they possess additional qualifications in economics or management.

In addition to demonstrating high motivation and interest in research through the cover letter and their CV, applicants are to submit a short essay of 1000 words on a specific topic of choice related to the quality of health care. Moreover, they are to indicate the research cluster(s) they are most interested in.
