Course Overview & syllabus:

The course “Managerial approaches to improving quality of care” will extend PhD students’ understanding of managerial concepts and approaches to improving the quality of care, and will include theoretical and empirical aspects. It will introduce theoretical concepts of quality of care and approaches of quality and risk management for hospitals and other providers, particularly from Germany and the US. We will discuss several research papers investigating managerial approaches to improving quality of care. Finally, students will be asked to analyze their currently planned PhD topic/paper along questions derived from course content and to present their results during the course.

The course is designed for PhD students of the Research Training Group ‘Managerial and economic dimensions of health care quality’ and it will but special emphasis on the subdiscipline of health economics / health care management.
